Here are some **RED FLAGS** to watch out for:

- 1) NEVER open your bank account online when some technician is on your computer.
- 2) The online computer tech groups are often scammers and can steal your money. Even if you have used them before and they seem okay, be cautious!
- Any calls that threaten to charge you, or give you a refund for something, are a red flag!
- Scammers commonly have you use VISA gift cards to pay them - DON'T.
- If you are being pressured, or being pushed with an urgency, do not listen to their reasons and do not turn on your computer.
- 6) If any computer technician wants you to leave your computer on overnight, or for several hours, they are setting you up to be taken advantage of.
- 7) Another red flag is if the group has no address and is secretive about their whereabouts.


